### **BELOVED COMMUNITY: LOOKING AHEAD TO 2018 Sunday, November 12, 10:00 a.m.**

**UCC Climate Justice at the State House Forum (at FCC), Today at 12:30 p.m., after coffee hour, MJH** Come hear how the UCC and other groups are asking Governor Baker to Take a Stand for the Climate and Stand Against New Fossil Fuel Infrastructure. We have invited Craig Altemose, Director of the Better Future Project, to brief us on what we are asking of Gov. Baker, and what is planned for the Nov. 16 sit-in at the Governor's office. We will have handouts of the letter delivered to Gov. The annual Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) memorializes individuals who have died throughout the world in the previous year because of anti-transgender hatred.
