

NO ORDINARY TIME: *Fall Adult Formation Opportunities* With Dan on Sabbatical through January, Reebee Girash serving as Sabbatical Interim Minister, Terry now serving as half-time Minister of Mental Health and Healing, Julie Rogers among us as our Affiliate Minister of Youth and Young Adults, and Brent Coffin as Scholar-in-Residence, this fall and winter will be no ordinary time. While there are seasons for proclamation, there are also seasons for deep listening. With so much new and changing, we have the chance to shift our awareness to listening deeply for how God is moving in our midst: sometimes stirring us, sometimes asking us to be still, meditating on where God is moving in our lives, the lives of others, and our congregation's future. To reflect that, the theme of our adult formation activities during this season will be *No Ordinary Time: An Invitation to Listen and Learn.* Our 10 O'clock Hours will offer several opportunities to participate in this theme of listening and learning during a time of change. Starting on September 16th, our offerings will include:

*Praying the Psalms*, in the Hastings Room, led by Terry McKinney and others: a six-week gathering to enter the Psalms more deeply, meditating on them, partnering in dialogue about their meaning to us, and praying about how they can and have shaped our lives.

Living the Questions Café, in Margaret Jewett Hall, led by Reebee Girash and others: an opportunity to get to know one another better and explore our faith more deeply, where each week a theme is introduced for meaningful discussion, as people gather in pairs or small groups to reflect and share.

**BOOK GROUP:** Hospitality, Food, and Communion Sometime in October we'll have a three-session book group on Sara Miles' book *Take This Bread: The Spiritual Memoir of a Twenty-First-Century Christian.* Sara Miles writes: "One early, cloudy morning when I was forty-six, I walked into a church, ate a piece of bread, took a sip of wine.... This was my first communion. It changed everything.... I discovered a religion rooted in the most ordinary yet subversive practice: a dinner table where everyone is welcome." In this memoir we'll encounter communion theology, reflections on hospitality and radical inclusion, explorations of food justice issues, and a personal conversion story — all in an eminently readable narrative. p.m., Hastings Room Lives Worth Living, a powerful documentary that chronicles the decades-long struggle for civil rights by people with disabilities, will provide background for discussion at the Disability Forum, sponsored by the Mission and Social Justice Committee and planned by the Disability/Access Team, on September 16. The film is an oral history of one of the great social justice movements in American history. It portrays a drive that brought together a once fragmented population into a powerful coalition that changed public perceptions and created some of the most far reaching civil rights legislation in our nation's history. The documentary was produced and directed by Eric Neudel for PBS Independent Lens in 2011. It traces the development of the disability rights movement from its beginning following World War II, when thousands of disabled veterans returned home, through the 1960s and 1970s when it began using the tactics of other civil rights movements, through to the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in 1990. A light cold lunch will be available at the coffee hour on September 16, so pick up your plate and beverage in Margaret Jewett Hall and bring them with you to the Hastings Room. Following the film there will be discussion of the issues it raises.
