

COMMUNITY PRAYERS

- We pray for our congregation during this time of transition.
- We pray for Gaylen Morgan as she prepares for knee replacement surgery on Monday.
- We pray for all who are living with significant health challenges and their families and caregivers: Poppy Coffin, who is experiencing Alzheimer's Disease; Carol Wilson-Braun, who is managing ALS; and Carter West, who is experiencing a chronic neurological disorder. We also pray for those in treatment for cancer: Bob Spaulding, Beth Spaulding's father; Dana Hunt, Claire Morgan's mother; Ellen Smith, Devin Hansen's aunt; Judith Semmler, Alice Napoleon Jones's mother; Karen Anne Zee's daughter Becky Collet and her son-in-law Stewart Bailey; Beth and Polly, Ann McCann's sisters; and Abby Shuman's uncle Barry.
- We pray for the many people seeking emergency shelter in overflow sites across the state, and for all who seek permanent housing.
- We pray for the community of Winder, GA, that is recovering after a school shooting at Apalachee High School. We pray for the families of those killed and for all who were injured. We continue to pray for our nation to embrace solutions to gun violence in all its forms.
- As the war in Gaza and Israel continues, our hearts cry out in prayer. We pray for those precious souls held hostage and for the families of those hostages who have been killed. We pray for the thousands in Gaza whose families and communities have been decimated and who are enduring hunger, homelessness, and acts of war. With the death of over 1,400 Israelis and over 40,000 Palestinians since October 7, we pray for an end to the war and immediate de-escalation of tensions in the region, as well as redoubled efforts to address the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.
- We pray for our nation during this election season that takes place during a time of political polarization. We pray especially for peaceful, non-violent engagement in the political processes of our democracy.
- We continue to pray for all who are recovering from natural and climate-related disasters. We pray for our rapidly warming planet and for efforts to reduce fossil fuel emissions.
- We pray for the people of the Democratic Republic of Congo, where ongoing armed conflicts have led to more than 6 million people killed and more than 5 million people displaced from their homes. We pray also for those who have experienced devastating incidents of gender-based violence during the conflicts.
- We pray for all those impacted by the violence of war and political upheaval throughout the Middle East, in Ukraine, in Sudan, and in Haiti.
- We pray for the wellbeing and safety of our trans and gender non-conforming siblings as they face the experience of vitriolic public discourse and of state laws that restrict and criminalize transgender health care, personal expression, and wider LGBTQ+ education.
- We continue to pray for those most affected by changes in reproductive rights: for all those struggling with the moral and political complexities of pregnancy and childbearing, and for patients and healthcare providers who are unable to give and receive care in their own states.

REGATHERING SEASON AT FIRST CHURCH

Staff Transitions, New Faces, and Shifting Roles - Fall 2024

As we regather this fall, the theme of transition can hardly be missed, especially within our staff. Here's a quick summary of how roles are shifting to meet the needs of the church.

Mike Solberg joins us as our new **Interim Senior Minister**. He fills the full-time role of Head of Staff as he walks with us through a time of transition. Mike will be leading worship and preaching; partnering with committees and boards on new initiatives and ongoing ministries; and providing pastoral care and spiritual guidance as we look forward to what comes next.

Emma Mitchell (née Thomas) returns in the role of **Pastoral Associate** (and with a new shared family last name after her wedding this summer). She will work 25 hours per week, participating in worship at least 2 Sundays per month, preaching, leading Christian formation, working with new members, and more.

Sarah Higginbotham takes on a new job title of Director of Communications & Christian Formation as she increases her hours to full-time. Sarah will continue to lead First Church's Communications Team, as well as supervise and/or lead in our Nursery, Church School, and Youth programs. While she no longer has "creative worship & arts" in her title, she still plans to share her creative gifts with our multigenerational community.

Kirsten Manville continues to be our **Director of Operations**, but with some accommodations for her growing family. On August 30, Kirsten and her husband Tim were officially matched and placed with a pre-adoptive child by the Massachusetts Department of Children and Families - a 10-year-old boy who will be in the 4th grade this year. Kirsten will be taking 4 full weeks of family leave this fall (September 16 - October 18) and then will work half-time through December 31. A sabbatical for Kirsten had already been planned and approved last spring, which is scheduled for January - March 2025. Stay tuned for more information about who will help cover her tasks while Kirsten is not as present with us during her family's time of transition.

Kevin Newell increases his hours to 35 per week as a **First Church Sexton**. He will be working most evening shifts, and he will also keep some hours at the First Church Shelter.

And after more than 35 years of faithful service to the First Church Shelter and the men who seek assistance from it, **Dennis Kaveney** has ended his full-time employment, but continues as a per diem **Shelter employee**. The Shelter Oversight Committee is planning an opportunity for the entire First Church community to celebrate and express gratitude for Dennis's contributions to the Shelter's mission to bring hope to our unhoused neighbors.

- Harvard Square churches, History Cambridge, and some staff and faculty at Harvard Divinity School are organizing to learn more about local indigenous history and current justice efforts, and to develop relationships with indigenous people. First Church members are welcome to join this work.
- There will be opportunities for **deeper learning and reflection on reparations, and for participating in local and state advocacy efforts**. Let us know if you'd like to hear about specific opportunities.
- We're looking for a few people who, in collaboration with First Parish, would like to **explore the role of our joint history of settler colonialism and enslavement** in preparation for the observance of the 400th anniversary of First Church (1636) and the settlement of European colonists in Cambridge (1630). Other research topics are also available: i.e. Did First Church members participate in the widespread abolitionist movement in the Boston area?
