
First Church Land Acknowledgment



COMMUNITY PRAYERS

Especially we pray for all whose lives are affected by political upheaval in Syria and South Korea and by wars in Gaza and Israel, Ukraine, the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Haiti, and Sudan. We pray for the dead, for their loved ones, and for their broader communities. We pray for changed hearts for all those inflicting violence upon others, and thus upon their own souls. We give thanks for the peacemakers. We pray that we, like they, may be free of the myth of redemptive violence, and take collective action, however small, to be people of true peace in this world.
- We pray for all those impacted by wildfires in southern California, and we continue to pray for our earth and all creation in the face of the climate crisis.
- We pray for the 14 men finding sustenance and protection in our First Church Shelter; and we pray for the guests of the Friday Café, who are finding resources and listening ears.



Exploring Hope for Peace and Justice in the Holy Land Thursdays, January 9, 16, 23, and 30, 6:30 - 8:00 p.m., via Zoom

Since the vicious attacks in Israel on October 7, 2023, and the unprecedented humanitarian disaster caused by Israel's war in Gaza, along with increased crackdowns in the West Bank, how can Christians effectively engage in this issue? This group will have the opportunity to begin engagement through discussion with fellow congregants.

While there will be some reading to get started, how we engage with this issue will be guided by the questions and interests of those who sign up. Examples may include questions such as what work is already being done between Palestinians and Israelis to promote reconciliation? What do we need to know about the history before October 7 to understand today? How can we support our Jewish and Palestinian neighbors? How can First Church engage with the Israel-Palestine Conflict as witnesses to Christ's peace, aware of power imbalances, but not falling into false binaries? Most importantly, what questions do you have that you would like the group to address?
